A completed entry acknowledges understanding and acceptance of all Conditions of Entry.

This event will be conducted in accordance with the current EA Dressage Rules (as amended) and FEI Dressage Rules (as amended).

Classes

Competitor Classes

- i. Rider must be a Competitor member of EA;
- ii. Horses & Ponies must be EA registered and hold a current Dressage Performance Card; Restricted Classes

Riders must be either a member of EA, or a member of the Southern Districts Dressage Club

Registration & Performance Cards All membership & registration documents must be available on request. (Copy of current valid Dressage Card to be provided with entry).

Dress Formal riding attire is required for all classes.

Plaiting of horses Horses are to be plaited in all classes.

Code of Conduct Please ensure you are familiar with the Equestrian WA Code of Conduct, available at www.wa.equestrian.org.au.

Warm up Etiquette. Correct protocol in the warm up area is expected. When lunging a helmet must be worn.

Protests and Appeals These must be in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$50. Refer to 'SDDC Protest Protocol' at www.sddc.org.au/site/competitions

Yards and Camping There are no yards available or camping at Centennial oval. Camping and overnight horse yards are available at Albany Equestrian Centre (see their website for further details).

Refunds and Scratchings Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date of entries unless a medical or veterinary certificate is produced within 5 days of the completion of the event and in such cases, there will be a full refund less an administration fee of \$20. Scratchings received in writing before the closing date of entry will receive a full refund.

Change of Riders & Horses Riders may be changed before the start of the class however a rider of a horse may not be changed if another rider has ridden the horse on the day either in warm-up or in the competition. Horses cannot be changed, and the draw position cannot be changed without the permission of the Organising Committee.

Presentations. Presentations will take place at the completion of the event. Competitors are asked to attend presentations in full competition dress. Presentations will not commence until all equipment is packed away.

Prizes Ribbons awarded to third place in all classes. There are no separate classes for Ponies. Prizes awarded to third place in each overall class (overall class combines both competitor and restricted classes at the given level) and prizes for regional championship.

Dogs Must be on a leash at all times. If complaints are made regarding an unruly dog the Organising Committee may require the dog to be removed from the event.

Officials, ground staff and volunteers These people are essential to the running of the event. Please treat them with respect. Poor sportsmanship will not be tolerated. Verbal or physical bullying behaviour will be reported to the Organising Committee and disciplinary action will be taken where appropriate.

Duty of Care It is your responsibility to promptly report unsafe and or hazardous situations to the Event Organiser.

Championships

Championship Awards

Regional Championship – A championship prize is awarded to; junior (16yrs and under) and senior (17yrs and over) rider at each level (Prep – Adv) for the highest scoring horse and rider combination who competed both of the following events; Mount Barker/Plantagenet Dressage Day (Feb), Albany Show Dressage Day (Nov).

Points are arrived from the overall placings at the given level. For each dressage test, points are awarded, based on the points system of 30 for 1st, 29 for 2nd, 28 for 3rd and so on, on placings gained within the overall class.

There will be no separate championships for ponies.

In the event of a tie, the Championship will be determined on the higher percentage in the higher individual dressage test at that level shall be the Champion.

If still tied, the higher collective marks in the higher individual test will decide, if the collective marks are equal, the collective marks of the Judge at C will be decisive.
